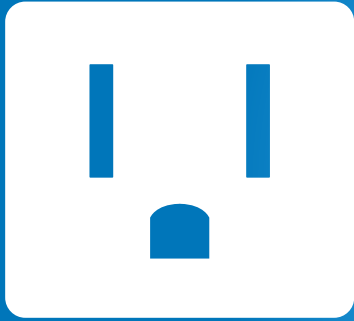
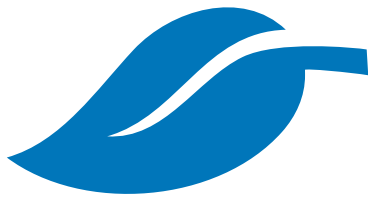


Why does my utility...

efficiency



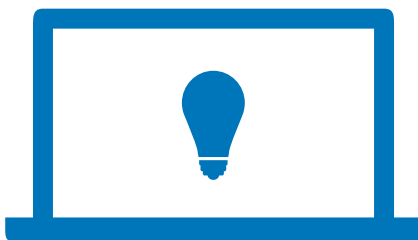
Rhode Island law **requires** the utility to invest in energy efficiency if it's cheaper than purchasing more power.



If we all use less, then we lower energy bills for **everyone**. Using less energy reduces costs to maintain infrastructure.



Your utility's profits are determined by the cost to maintain the energy grid, **NOT** by how much electricity it sells.
