The Evaluation Team (ET), comprised of Betsy Stubblefield Loucks, Karen Verrengia, and Becca Trietch, two voting members of the Energy Efficiency and Resources Management Council (EERMC) and a state employee with the Office of Energy Resources respectively, reviewed the one (1) proposal received by the Energy Efficiency and Resource Management Council (EERMC) on January 31, 2018 for the subject EERMC-2017-03 – Needs Assessment for Energy Education. The valuation was based on the following criteria: 1. Overview and Work Plan (35 points), 2. Qualifications and Experience (25 Points), 3. Project Management and Organization (10 points), 4. ISBE proposal (6 points), and 5. Cost proposal (30 points).

Based on the review of the proposal submitted, the ET believes that the Evergreen Economics proposal offers all the components that this requisition specifies with an appropriate cost to the Council.

The ET proposes that the contract with Evergreen Economics be limited to one (1) year from the contract start date and be limited to a total dollar amount of \$25,000. The ET also encourages the Council to accept the workplan as submitted by Evergreen Economics on 1/31/2018 as the basis of the contract, and to have OER work with Evergreen Economics to expand the scope of work to encompass primary data collection from the following groups for \$10,000 or less: Public Officials and Business Stakeholders.
