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# First Quarter 2025 Highlights

- **Residential Equity Outreach Assessment:** 4 landlord sessions in English and Spanish, totaling 78 attendees
- Large Commercial Retrofit:
  - Re-signed SEMP agreements with Raytheon and Providence College
  - "2025 Energy Outlook" discussion with Quonset Development Corporation, with 20+ participants
- **Residential New Construction:** GrowSmartRI Outstanding Smart Growth Project Award (for Residences at Riverside Square)
- Small Business Direct Install: Targeted outreach to increase WMOB (Women and Minority-Owned Business) participation







# First Quarter Performance Overview



- Tracking system hurdles at Year End, and normal hockey stick effect, resulted in some reporting lag
- Reporting in future quarters is expected to be smoother

# **Residential Sector Performance**





- Electric savings on par with previous years
- Dip in gas savings driven by EWSF and EWMF lag

# Income Eligible Sector Performance



- Programs were active, but no savings were tracked for Q1 due to lag in project processing
- The focus was on getting 2024 Year End numbers up-to-date
- 146 weatherization projects were completed by Income Eligible Single Family program

#### **EWG requests:**

- Track EJ vs Non-EJ community participants over time
- Income Eligible barriers by type
  - DHS uses broader barrier categories
  - Only "hard barriers" for now
- Conversion rates (Audit > Deferral > Resolution > Weatherization)
  - Hoping to incorporate in future versions
  - Resolved deferrals are challenging to track
